

Floating Support Service

The aim of the Floating Support service is to provide appropriate individualised support enabling individuals to manage their own homes in the community.

The key aims of the service are to:

- Help to locate and secure good quality accommodation
- Assist individuals to maintain their tenancies
- Advise on finance and budgeting
- Help with practical tasks in relation to housing
- Support with everyday tasks associated with daily living.
- Provide emotional support where needed.



The Floating Support service has made it possible to provide continuity in people's lives as they develop their independence and move from another of the organisation's services into the community.

Who is the service for?

- The Floating Support service is available to individuals with a learning disability between the ages of 17 and 75



How are the aims achieved?

- Following a referral an assessment is carried out to enable an appropriate support package to be agreed.
- A Support Agreement will be developed which identifies what the individual can expect from the service and which will outline the responsibilities of the person being supported.
- Each person will be allocated a key support worker to co-ordinate the Support Plan and maintain links with statutory agencies.

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
