

Floating Support Service

The Floating Support service offered by Salter's Hill Charity aims to provide appropriate individualised support enabling individuals to manage their own homes in the community.

The key aims of the service are to:

- Help to locate and secure good quality accommodation
- Assist individuals to maintain their tenancies
- Advise on finance and budgeting
- Help with practical tasks in relation to housing
- Support with everyday tasks associated with daily living.
- Provide emotional support where needed.



A Support Agreement will be developed which identifies what the individual can expect from the service. It will also outline the responsibilities of the person being supported.

Each person will be allocated a key support worker to co-ordinate the Support Plan and maintain links with statutory agencies.



The Floating Support service is available to individuals with a learning disability between the ages of 17 and 75

Referrals:

Most referrals will usually be made through the Supporting People team, and if the referral matches our Eligibility Criteria an assessment is carried out to enable an appropriate support package to be agreed.

The Floating Support team has enabled us to provide continuity in people's lives as they develop their independence and move from another of the organisation's services into the community.

Salter's Hill Charity has successfully met the requirements of a number of accreditations including Investors in People, Contractors Health & Safety Assessment Scheme, acquA, and the European Quality Standard ISO 9001 as well as the Environmental accreditation 14001:2000.

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
